Agriculture

Agriculture *noun* the art and science of cultivating the soil, growing crops and raising livestock.

Community

Community Agriculture incorporates many groups and individuals to provide access to agricultural production.

For a project to be "community agriculture", it must include at least one of the following aspects:

Supports local food systems

Leverages volunteer and community engagement

Meets additional goals to just producing

Can be applied in densely populated urban areas

Makes agriculture more accessible through education and land access

Element of public good

Producing for community building, personal use, food security.

More than one producer utilizes a space

Considers safe growing techniques in urban areas

If one of these aspects is met, it may also include one of the following economic development aspects:

Agritourism

Business Development

Builds ordinance and policy to meet food system needs

Gleaning

Individual

Individual Agriculture provides agricultural production on a commercial scale or solely private use. Individual agriculture may support community agriculture initiatives, but as a stand alone effort it does not meet the requirements of community agriculture.

If any of these aspects are met, it must include aspects under the first section.

Private production for personal use

Producing for individual profit

Privately owned

Paid Employees
